Eugene L. FUCHS, Z-189654, oiler, age 32 years, Born: 5 April, 1912, at Railroad Flat, California, 5'8"- brown hair- blue eyes- ruddy complexion. Sailed as an oiler on the S/S. MALCOIM M. STEWART. Reported to be decidedly pro-communist and critical of Marine Officers. (Appears on Merchant Marine Suspect List).

2. Subject was interviewed aboard the FARRAR, and indentified as the above mentioned subject. Subject is not known personally to any of the ship's officers.
