2. On her present voyage to Baltimore, Md., the vessel carries one lot of 58,537.52 barrels (42 American gallons each) of Naranjos crude oil in bulk, equivalent to 8,505.31 tons. Cargo is shipped by Petroleos Mexicanos and consigned to the Eastern States Petroleum Co. Inc., Baltimore, Md.. Vessel carries bunkers and supplies for 15 days over and above that required for the voyage.

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
