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EXCERPT FROM 6ND BOARDING REPORT, "SS A.S. HANSEN", (US), 12 AUGUST 1943.

"Lt.(jg) JORDAN stated that Captain NYGAARD permits those members of the crew desiring to do so to bring whiskey aboard. According to Lt. (jg) JORDAN, this practice resulted in a fight at sea between the boatswain, who was very drunk, and one of the deck engineers. He stated that he stopped the fight himself, upon the refusal of the Captain to interfere, because he feared one of the men might be killed or thrown overboard."
