(C) ONE ROUND FIRED AT 70 DEGREES ELEVATION 2. THE FIRING WAS DONE AT THE ABOVE ELEVATIONS

AS THE SHIP WAS TRAVELLING IN CONVOY AND IT WAS THOUGHT THAT THE GREATEST DEGREE OF SAFETY TO OTHER SHIPS WOULD BE OBTAINED AT THESE ELEVATIONS.
