IN REFERENCE TO "I" ABOVE, WOULD LIKE TO RECOMMEND THAT THE NAVY HAVE SOME POWER TO SUPERVISE OR JUDGE THE SELECTION OF THE STEWARD'S PERSONNEL ON MERCHANT SHIPS HAVING NAVAL GUN CREWS. IT IS MIGHTY DIFFICULT TO SEE THE BEST OF GRUB SPOILED AND DUMPED INTO THE SEA DAY AFTER DAY. AND THE MEN ARE LOSING WEIGHT STEADILY (ON MY SHIP AT LEAST). IT IS A POOR SYSTEM WHICH TURNS OUT MEN WHO ARE SUPPOSED TO BE COOKS. THOSE MEN REPORTING ABOARD, FINDING THE JOB TOO MUCH FOR THEIR LIMITED EXPERIENCE, AND TURNING DOWN THE JOB FOR MESS BOY IWORK.
