This diary was intercepted by the U. S. Customs at San Francisco, California, March 22, 1943, and consists of 14 pages.

This is a logbook or diary kept by the crew on board the ship S.S. Andrew Carnegie, which sailed from Seattle, Washington, to Australia, (Shanghai according to original). It extends over a period of 19 days, Feb. 18, 1943 to March 7, 1943.

The writer describes the voyage of his ship, the S.S. Carnegie from the shores of the State of Washington to the shores of the State of California and tells in detail various tasks he performed on board ship.

DISCLOSURE OF SHIP MOVEMENTS, AND DATES OF ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE

This diary was intercepted by the U. S. Customs in SAN FRANCISCO, from EDSEL M. JOHNS, crew member of the S.S. ANDREW CARNEGIE.

This is a lengthy personal diary (written in pencil on loose sheets of stationery), entitled "PART II, A VOYAGE TO AUSTRALIA". (EXAMINER: Spelling as in original). It extends over a period of three weeks, Feb. 13, 1943 to March 7, 1943.

The writer describes the voyage of his ship, the S.S. CARNEGIE from the ISLANDS OF THE SOUTH PACIFIC to SAN FRANCISCO, giving ports of call and dates of arrival and departure. Writer also tells in detail about various tasks he performed on board ship.
