Synopsis:

Ingvald Kr. EIDE, Master of the Panamanian S.S. ANEROID, which was torpedoed October 2, 1942, off British Guiana, reported that SUBJECT is a troublemaker. The ship's articles show SUBJECT to be a native of Norway, thirty-eight years of age, 5'9" tall, brown hair, fair complexion, and gives his home address as 31 Skipergaten, Oslo, Norway. Captain EIDE described SUBJECT as being a dissolute drunkard who would become insensibly intoxicated while on shore leave and as a consequence would not be capable of performing his duties after the vessel had sailed from port. SUBJECT was described as a big talker, and he assisted Jorgen SKAUGEN, (See Reference a), John LEBBINK, (See Reference b), and Cornelis KURVINK, (see Reference c), in sowing dissension aboard the S/S ANEROID, often making exorbitant demands on the Captain for advances in pay and shore leave. Captain EIDE feels that SUBJECT is a dangerous man to have aboard an Allied vessel.
