Synopsis:

Ingvald Er. HIDE, Destar of the Familian SS AMEROID, stated that his ship was torpedeed and sunk on October 2, 1942, off British Guiana, Captain SIDE related that the crow aboard this ship was composed of Beandinaviana, Butch, Irish, English, and other nationalities, and in his opinion was one of the worst crows he had ever seen. There was constant dissension between the ship's officers and the crow, and this feeling was largely fostered by the subjects of References (a), (b), (c), and (d). Captain EIDE related that on September 22, 1942, while the SS AMEROID was in Fort of Spain, Trinidad, B. W. I., a petition (Enclosure A) was presented, demanding money and shore leave under threat of discontinuance of work. Among the 16 names appearing on this petition was that of SUBJECT. Captain EIDE explained that some of the crow was forced to sign this petition and others cravenly signed to avoid the displeasure of the ringleaders. Captain EIDE believes that if SMAUGHM, LEBRING, EURIVIER, and ARDERSEN had not been aboard, the area would have been manageable. SUBJECT and the remainder of the signers of the petition, however, have evidenced that they can be builted or persuaded to east their let with troublemakers aboard ship. The ship's articles describe SUBJECT as an A. B. Seaman, Ewedish citizen, 25 years of age, single, 5° 5° tall, fair complexion, blue eyes, home address Bagtsbode Abshelm,
