Ingvald Kr. EIDE, Master of the Panamanian SS AMEROID, stated that his Synopsis: ship was torpedoed and sunk on October 2, 19h2, off British Guiana. Captain KIDE related that the crew aboard this ship was composed of Scandinavians, Dutch, Irish, English, and other nationalities, and in his opinion was one of the worst crews he had ever seen. There was constant dissension between the ship's officers and the erew, and this feeling was largely fostered by the subjects of References (a), (b), (c), and (d). Captain EIDE related that on September 22, 1962, while the SS ANEROID was in Port of Spain, Trinidad, B. W. I., a petition (Enclosure A) was presented, demanding sensy and shore leave under threat of discontinuance of work. Among the 16 names appearing on this petition was that of SUBJECT. Captain HIDE explained that some of the erew was forced to sign this petition and others cravenly signed to avoid the displeasure of the ringleaders. Captain RIDE believes that if SKAUGEN, LEBEIRK, KURVINK, and AMDERSEN had not been aboard, the crow would have been manageable. SUBJECT and the remainder of the signers of the petition, however, have evidenced that they can be bullied or persuaded to cast their lot with troublemakers aboard ship. The ship's articles described SUBJECT as Ordinary Seaman, Swedish citizen, 26 years of age, 5° 8" tall, having fair complexion and brown hair.
