Ingvald Kr. EIDE, Master of the Panamanian S/S ANEROID, which was torpedoed October 2, 1942, off British Guiana, stated that SUBJ SUT was a chronic troublemaker aboard the S/S ANGROID. The ship's articles list SUBJECT as a Morwegian AB seamen, forty years of age, five feet in height, black hair, fair complexion, and gives his home address as 656 46th St., Brooklyn, N. Y. According to Captain EIDE, the entire crew of the S/S ANSHOID was kept in a constant turmoil by the prodding of SUBJECT, who was always making outrageous demands of the ship's officers for shore leave, pay advancements, and shipboard privileges. SUBJECT was the instigator of a petition addressed to Captain EIDS while the ship was in Fort of Spain, Trinidad, on 9-22-42, (See Enclosure A), which demanded money and shore leave and threatened that work in all departments would coase if not granted. This letter was signed by a mumber of men of the crew, but numerous ones were badgered into signing it by SUBJECT. Captain EIDE also advised that SUBJECT cursed him and attempted to assume a voice in the operation of the vessel. SUBJECT is said to be a confirmed drunkard who becomes insensibly intoxicated when given shore leave and money. Captain EIDE feels that SUBJECT should be barred from the sea.
