Synopsis: Captain Ingvald Kr. BIDE, Master of the Penamanian SS ANDROID, stated that his ship was torpedoed and sunk on October 2, 1942, off British Quiana. Captain BIDE related that the crew aboard this ship was composed of Scandinavians, Dutch, Irish, English, and other nationalities, and in his opinion was one of the worst crows he had ever seen. There was constant dissension between the ship's officers and the crew, and this feeling was largely festered by the subjects of References (a), (b), (c), and (d). Captain EIDE related that on September 22, 1942, while the SS ANERCID was in Port of Spain, Trinidad, B. W. I., a petition (Enclosure A) was presented, demanding money and shore leave under threat of discontinuance of work. Among the 16 names appearing on this petition was that of SUBJECT. Captain RIDE explained that some of the orew was forced to sign this petition and others cravenly signed to avoid the displeasure of the ringleaders. Captain BIDE believes that if SKAUDEN, LESSINE, KURVINE, and AMDERSEN had not been aboard, the orew would have been manageable. SUBJECT and the remainder of the signers of the petition, however, have evidenced that they can be bullied or persuaded to east their lot with troublemakers aboard ship. The ship's articles describe SUBJECT as Fireman, Swedish citizen, 24 years of age, 5: 10" tall, with fair complexion and black hair. SUBJUCT'S home address is Box Deductions: 1, Cokalund, Sweden. His next of kin is Earl MILSEN, who resides at the same address.
