Synopsis: Ingvald Kf. HIDE, Master of the Panamanian SS ANEROID, stated that his ship was torpedoed and sunk on October 2, 1942, off British Guiana. Captain HIDE related that the crew aboard this ship was composed of Scandinavians, Dutch, Irish, English, and other nationalities, and in his opinion was one of the worst crews he had ever seen. There was constant dissension between the ship's officers and the crew, and this feeling was largely fostered by the subjects of References (a), (b), (c), and (d). Captain HIDE related that on September 22, 1942, while the SS ANEROID was in Port of Spain, Trinidad, B.W.I., a petition (Enclosure A) was presented, demanding money and shore leave under threat of discontinuance of work. Among the 16 names appearing on this petition was that of SUBJECT. Captain HIDE explained that some of the crew was forced to sign this petition and others gravenly signed to avoid the displeasure of the ringleaders. Captain HIDE believes that if SKAUGEN, LEBBINK, KURVINK, and ANDERSEN had not been aboard, the crew would have been manageable. SUBJECT and the remainder of the signers of the petition, however, have evidenced that they can be bullied or persuaded to cast their lot with troublemakers aboard ship. The ship's articles describe SUBJECT as a fireman, Norwegian citizen, 42 years of age, single, 5' 7" tall, having fair complexion and gray hair. SUBJECT'S home address is given as 1412 Front Street, Salt Lake City, Utah, his next of kin is W. SOMMERVOLD, same address as SUBJECT.
