Ingvald Kr. BIDE, Master of the Panamanian SS ANEROID, stated that his ship was torpedoed and sunk on October 2, 1942, off British Quiana. Captain EIDE related that the crew aboard this ship was composed of Scandinavians, Dutch, Irish, English, and other nationalities, and in his opinion was one of the worst orews he had ever seen. There was constant dissension between the ship's officers and the crew, and this feeling was largely fostered by the subjects of References (a), (b), (c), and (d). Captain EIDS related that on September 22, 1942, while the SS AMEROID was in Port of Spain, Trinidad, B.W.I., a petition (Enclosure A) was presented, demanding money and shore leave under threat of discontinuance of work. Among the 16 names appearing on this petition was that of SUBJECT. Captain EIDE explained that some of the erew was forced to sign this petition and others oravenly signed to avoid the displeasure of the ringleaders. Captain EIDE believes that if SHAUDEN, LEB-BINE, KURVINE, and ANDERSEN had not been aboard, the crew would have been manageable. SUBJECT and the remainder of the signers of the petition, however, have evidenced that they can be bullied or persuaded to cast their lot with troublemakers abourd ship. The ship's articles describe SUBJECT as an A.B. Seeman, Swedish citizen, 22 years of age, single, 5: 92" tall, fair complexion, brown hair, home address Matmo, Sweden, next of kin Emil LARSEN, Matmo, Sweden.
