1. The Panamanian 3/5 AMEROID and the following armament was found on board:

was inspected this date

GUNS AND AMMUNITION: 1 - 4" mark IX model 5, 1915 No. 505. Elevation 30° # 5°. Arc of train 320°. Telescopic sights. Located on special raised platform after end of peop deck. 100-rds fixed ammunition.

SMALL ARMS AND ALMUNITION: 4-Levis .30 machine guns; machine gun mounts located (2) wings of bridge. (2) aft end poop deck; 11.000 rounds of ammunition.

MAGAZINE: Port side aft in lazaret space. Flooded by permanent flood line.

FIRE CONTROL AND COMMUNICATION: Telephone.

PERSONNEL: Gun's crew taken from ship's regular force.

MISCELLANEOUS: 1-civilian duty gas mask; 1-convoy light and 1-convoy buoy; 4-bomb-proof shelters located (2) wings of bridge, (2) after end poop deck; armor plates around the bridge and radio room; DeGaussed (wired).

- 2. It is the opinion of this office that the above-mentioned armament is carried for defensive purposes only, provided the vessel is employed in normal trade.
 - 3. Inclosed are two (2) photographs of this vessel, showing her guns and their location.
