The "ANNISTON CITY", American freighter, en route Capetown to Baltimore, reports firing two shots at submarine 175 mi. south of Bermuda, 2950 N. 6445 W., 2205 GCT, 8 June 1942. Conning tower was above surface, visibility was fair, submarine about 3 mi. distant. Second shot was directly in line with submarine, but fell $\frac{1}{2}$ mi. short. Submarine crash-dived, "ANNISTON CITY" turned away and increased speed to $12\frac{1}{2}$ knots maximum.

"STEEL NAVIGATOR", following "ANNISTON CITY", was notified and followed away from submarine
