EXCERPTS FROM A BOARDING REPORT WHICH MAY BE OF INTEREST TO COAST GUARD

12ND BOARDING REPORT, SS ANTIGUA (U.S.)

9-24-42

"Both the Master and the Chief Officer said that there had been considerable bootlegging of liquor by some members of the crew but as yet they have been unable to locate the guilty parties. The liquor is brought aboard in Honolulu in pints and is sold for \$12 to \$15 a bottle to the civilian and Naval passengers. Owing to the large profit the quantity is increasing with each successive trip and the Master expressed the wish that some outside help be given to stop this practice.
