Subject: S.S. ARTHUR ORR; strike on.

1. Mr. Kruger of Canada Atlantic Transportation Company informed the District Office that subject vessel was docked at 106th Street in South Chicago, Illinois and having labor trouble.

2. Mr. P. G. Pettersen of Bureau of Marine Inspection and Navigation was contacted and stated that he was investigating this matter to see whether any of their laws are being violated.

3. I telephoned the Edward R. Bacon Grain Company to contact Mr. Kruger. He was out, but was informed that the crew of the ARTHUR ORR was on a strike and that the local police had been requested to protect property. Two policemen were to be assigned to their property which is where the ARTHUR ORR is berthed.
