requested. In the event that the subject vessel endeavors to enter a port
of the United States without the required Bill of Health, a violation of
the Act of February 15, 1893, Section 2 (42 U.S.C. 82) is incurred. Enforce-
ment of this act is not within the province of H. A. BURCH, Section. The
violation should be reported by the Lieut. Comdr. U.S.N.R. a Federal
Attorney upon the arrival of the vessel within the United States.

MEMORANDUM FOR LT. COMDR. H. A. BURCH: 5448

1. Returned.
2. The records at Coast Guard Headquarters show that the Subject vessel at the time of the incident referred to in Enclosure (A) was under Panamanian registry and the name of the Master is not available.
3. In the event the Subject vessel endeavors to enter a port of the United States without the required Bill of Health, a violation of the Act of February 15, 1893, Section a(42USC82) will be incurred. Such violations are reported by the Collector of Customs at the Port of arrival to the Federal District Attorney upon the arrival of the vessel within the United States.


