Sir:

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Reference is made to copy of report of Charles F. Anepohl, Captain Customs Guards, dated April 1, 1941, relative to certain information obtained by Clarence Johnston, Customs Guard, in that there was suspicion of sabotage on the Norwegian S.S. BALLA which arrived in tow from Houston, Texas, March 30, 1941.

During an investigation relative to sabotage, the following was learned:

Mr. Basile J. Rusovich, manager of the marine department of the Dixie Machine Works, 1031 Annunciation Street, New Orleans, was interviewed, and he stated that while the BALLA was at Houston, a contract was let to repair its engines. The firm taking this contract dismantled one motor and then abandoned the job.

The ship's owners then called for more bids to repair and recondition both motors. This vessel is a twin screw and powered with two Diesel engines. Two local concerns bid on these repairs, The Todd Shipbuilding Company, whose bid was \$89,000, and the Dixie Machine Welding and Metal Works, Inc., whose bid, the lowest, was \$72,000. No bid has been accepted yet.

Mr. Rusovich further stated that from the condition that the motors of this boat were found in when inspected by his mechanics, it would be hard to state whether there was any sabotage or not. He also stated that these engines could be sabotaged by an expert in such a way that an experienced mechanic could not detect same until trial and with the use of precision instruments.

At the present time the ship's owners are negotiating for a bid to repair these motors temporarily and not to recondition them as the first bid required. In event the Dixie Machine Company obtains the repair contract on this vessel, this office would be advised should a mechanical inspection show sabotage.
