Subject: Armed Merchant Vessels.

Reference: (a) Your letter, 10 October, 1941 (WML:cm)

1. The British S/S BELLE ISLE was inspected this date and the following armament was found on board:

GUNS AND AMMUNITION: 1 - Q.F. 12-pdr 12-Cwt R.C.F. 1918N. No. 6541. Elevation 20° + 15°. Arc of train 360°. Telescopic sights. Located aft end top of aft deck house. 51-rds powder charges; 50-rds H.E. shells and 3-rds practice shells.

SMALL ARMS AND AMMUNITION: 2-Ross rifles .303 and 480-rds ammunition.

MAGAZINE: Port side aft end in poop deck house. Flooded by hose only.

FIRE CONTROL AND COMMUNICATION: Telephone. 1-Morse (day) lamp.

PERSONNEL: 1-Gun layer (Royal Canadian Navy); balance of gun's crew taken from ship's regular force; 1-certified merchant navy defense officer on board.

MISCELLANEOUS: 1-steel helmet; 1-service gas mask; 1-Schermuly pistol and 4-rockets (distress type); 1-P.A.C. projector, 4-rockets and 4-fouling cables; This vessel is not DeGaussed.

2. It is the opinion of this office that the above-mentioned armament is carried for defensive purposes only, provided, that the vessel is employed in normal trade.

3. Inclosed herewith are no photographs of this vessel, showing her guns and their location.
