(The following from Aruba, ^{ONE (2)} N. W. I., dated 8 April, 1944, is forwarded for your information: J. GIKAS

(8) "The SS BETA was stopped for repairs on 31 March, 1944, while enroute from Guantanamo to Curacao. She was unable to proceed on 1 April, 1944, and a tug was requested. The PARMO took her in tow. The ship is old and has had numerous mechanical failures recently."
