In view of the fact that the cases are over a year old and some of the witnesses have been transferred, the United States Attorney recommends the above-mentioned offer be accepted, and you request the Coast Guard's views and recommendations in the matter. The Goast Guard has reviewed the file in these cases and is of the opinion that in view of the circumstances and the recommendation of the United States Attorney, the compromise offer of \$500 for each of the offenses, without proctor's docket fee, but with other court costs to be charged to the claimant, should be accepted.
