MEMORANDUM FOR THE CHAIRMAN OF THE CREW DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE,
WAR SHIPPING ADMINISTRATION.

The Coast Guard has received from a reliable source the following information concerning Jack Anderson, AB on the SS BIG FOOT WALLACE.

Report states that Anderson was tried before a Summary Court in Alexandria, Egypt, in July 1943 on a charge of violating the 93rd Article of War.

The specification alleged that Anderson, about 9 July, 1943, did feloniously take, steal and carry away approximately nine pounds twenty five piastres (LE 9.25) Egyptian currency, the property of one Maryan Lukaszuk.

Anderson was found guilty on the charge and specification and a sentence to hard labor for 3 months was approved by the reviewing authority.

The Coast Guard will instigate whatever further disciplinary action may be warranted in this case.
