May 31, 1942, 9 a.m., and to subsequent correspondence, names of any informants relative to the explosions which took place here on May

31, last, in the tanks of the American tanker Cacalilao, and to inform the Department that the Cacalilao left here at 9 a.m., June 26th for Galveston via Corpus Christi, in company with the American tug Miraflores.

I am enclosing, as of possible interest, sixteen photographs, taken from various angles, showing the damage suffered by the tanker and the adjacent wharves as a result of the explosions and of the fire which followed them. CONFIDENTIAL
