Panama steamship "CALLIROY".

p.m. on June 18th from Curacao, N.W.I. This vessel was enroute to Warner, New Jersey with a cargo of fuel oil for the Cities Service Corp. The oil was loaded on board at Curacao from the Asiatic Oil Company which is a subsidiary of the Shell Oil Co. a British concern. The vessel put into San Juan account of having a sick seaman on board who was in need of immediate medical attention.

- 2. This vessel was formerly owned by the Union Oil Company of California and sailing under the Panama flag. Upon inquiry from the master it was learned that the vessel had been sold during the past few months to a Nikloas Conilides whose address is Reconquista 336, Buenos Aires, Argentina who has resided in Argentina for the past 19 years, the master was unable to state whether or not if the new owner was a Greek national. During this transfer the name of the vessel was changed from SANTA MARIA to CALLIROY. The present agents are C.G. Gratsos, care of GEN. STEMCO. Battery Place, San Francisco. The Master of the vessel at present is A, Morland, a U. S. citizen.
- 3. In view of the uncertainity of the ownership of the vessel the radio was not sealed.
