SOURCE OF COMPLAINT: Report from The Commanding Officer,
Port Security Command, dated 5 March, 1945.

FACTS: The S.S. CALVIN COOLIDGE was at anchor at F. A. 22
at 1430, 3 March, 1945, at which time the Coast Guard Boat 38487
discovered some oil running down the ship's side from the settling
tank overflow. Upon investigation, it was found that the heat
had been turned on the settling heating coils, which caused the
oil to expand, and a slight amount of oil found its way into
the waters of New York Harbor. This Unit has endeavored to con-
tact Mr. T. P. McCarthy, second assistant engineer, and Mr.
A. Colligers, chief engineer, both from the above vessel, but
have been unsuccessful.

CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS: Inasmuch as this spill was
of a very minor nature and in view of our inability to contact
the persons involved, it is recommended that the case be closed
without further action.
