MATHIES, messman aboard "CAPE BEALE" states that in April 1944 while in the Port of Brisbane, Australia, aboard the SS "ROBERT S. BEAN" he pleaded guilty before Coast Guard Hearing Unit to a charge of refusing to obey lawful orders of the Steward, resulting in a sentence of six months probation. MATHIES holds U.S. Passport No. 180723 dated 4 February, 1944; COTP (St. Petersburg, Florida) 0754491 issued 16 December, 1943; and Z-468768 issued 17 December, 1943 at Tampa, Florida with Sixth Naval District Security Indorsement dated 13 November, 1944.
