MEMORANDUM FOR THE CHAIRMAN OF THE CREW DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE,
WAR SHIPPING ADMINISTRATION.

The Coast Guard has received information from a reliable source concerning Sigurd Henry Johansen, former oiler-fireman aboard the SS CAPE ST. ELIAS and the SS WINSLOW HOMER. Report alleges Johansen became intoxicated in Capetown in June 1943 and missed the sailing of the CAPE ST. ELIAS. He also missed the sailing of the WINSLOW HOMER for the same reason in August 1943 when it sailed from Port of Spain, Trinidad. *file*

The Coast Guard will instigate whatever disciplinary action is warranted in this case.
