Report states that Tranum came aboard ship in a drunken condition at Valparaiso just as his ship was leaving the dock. In view of the fact Tranum was not aboard prior to sailing time, the Master had ordered his gear packed in order to leave it ashore. Tranum, on arrival aboard, went to the bridge and berated the Master for having molested his gear and, furthermore, refused to leave the bridge on the Master's order. It was also reported that on the voyage from Valparaiso to Balboa in March, 1944, Tranum made attempts to induce crew members to sign a spurious statement that the Master was an excessive drinker.
