Subj: USAT "COVENTRY"

1. The Superintendent, Water Division, Army Service Forces, Charleston Port of Embarkation, advised this office that the merchant seamen listed below were discharged 10 March, 1945, at Jacksonville, Florida, from SUBJECT vessel for being drunk and disorderly, refusing to turn to, absent from vessel for days without permission, for being generally insubordinate and whose misconduct caused serious interference with cargo salvage operations, to the expense and inconvenience of the government.
