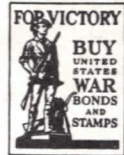

MEMORANDUM FOR COMMANDER F. E. POLLIO

I am returning the enclosures that accompanied your memorandum of 20 July, relative to the SS DEL SUD at New York. The officer who effected this boarding reported on 9 July, was given instructions on the 10th and the 11th, and on the 12th (the date of the boarding in question) was performing his first work alone. I think this is an obvious answer. Needless to say, he has been set right with respect to interrogation relative to conduct of Navy personnel. So far as I know (I was away at the time of the occurrence) this matter was not broached locally.
