SOURCE OF COMPLAINT: Letter from Supervisor of New York Harbor dated 30 October, 1944.

FACTS: The SS EDWARD L. SHEA was cleaning tanks with the Butterworth System on 27 October, 1944, while berthed at the Tidewater Terminal, Bayenne, New Jersey. At that time Mr. J. R. Herries, Surveyor from the office of the Supervisor of New York Harbor, noted an oil slick in the office of the Supervisor of New York Harbor, noted an oil slick in the water which he claimed he had traced to the EDWARD L. SHEA. According to the statement of Mr. George H. Welker whet according to the articles of the SHEA was Chief Engineer, the vessel was cleaning tanks with the Butterworth System and the slop water from the tanks was pumped through a line connected to the piping system of the SHEA. This water was discharged into a tank ashore and separated and only the clean water was let into the waters of New York Harbor from these shore tanks. There was no discharge from the SHEA except the circulating and sanitary discharges, and at no time were there any bilges being pumped. There is no indication that any oil was pumped everboard from the SHEA.

CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS: Inasmuch as there is no evidence that any cil was discharged from the SHEA, it is recommended that the case be closed without any further action.

Precinct and on October 27th on duty with the First Platoon reports that at 2:40 A.M. today, Customs Guard E. A. LIPPMAN on duty with the First Platoon of this date and assigned to the inner gate of the Tidewater Terminal, Bayonne, N. J. telephoned the office of the Lieutenant and reported that oil was being discharged from the American tanker EDWARD L. SHEA into the waters of Kill Van Kull.
