The American S/S EL COSTON was inspected this date and the following armament was found on board:

GUNS AND AMMUNITION: 1 - 4" mk. IX mod. V 1458, 1919. Elevation 50° 4 5°. Arc of train 360°. Telescopic sights. Located after end top of after deck house.

SMALL ARMS AND ALMUNITION: 4-Lewis .30 machine guns. (Mounts: portable).

MAGAZINE: Starboard side in lazaret space. Flooded by hose only.

FIRE CONTROL AND COMMUNICATION: Telephone.

PERSONNEL: Taken from ship's regular force.

MISCELLANEOUS: 2-Buoys; 4-bomb proof shelters, (2) after end of bridge deck, (2) after end of boat deck; concrete slabs around rediorcom; concrete slabs and armor plate around bridge; hull DeGaussed (wired).

- It is the opinion of this office that the above-mentioned armament is carried for defensive purposes only, provided the vessel is employed in normal trade.
