I. REVEALS DETAILS OF PART OF SHIP'S VOYAGE

Writer, in a letter written in diary form, reveals sailing date and name of last port of call before getting to destination. Upon arriving at destination he mentions docking date and also that he "Met all the other Liberty ships, that came over with us going out." giving the names of some of these ships. He further reveals part of his ship's cargo. He then gives the date the convoy will start on its return trip mentioning when he will get back to the United States.

II. MENTIONS NUMBER AND NAMES OF SHIPS SUNK

Writer mentions the number and names of all the ships on which he had been, that were sunk.
