Subj: Anonymous Complaint.

1. The inclosed anonymous complaint was received by this office. The action taken was to peruse the official log of the SS EXCALIBUR for voyage commencing 27 April, 1950 and terminating on 14 June, 1950. It was noted that the only loggings concerned the steward's department. None of the deck or engine department were logged. Further, the special agent of the FBI at New York who has been investigating subversives in this category, was advised of the letter and given the names of those mentioned.

2. While no action under R. S. 4450 was contemplated in this matter, it is now believed in the light of recent developments that it should be forwarded to HQ for information.
