BOSTON, Nov. 27 (AP)—The American Export Line's steamer Exchange arrived today from India with reports that a German raider, credited with sinking at least five British vessels in September and October, still was active in the Indian Ocean.

The crew said that before the vessel left the captain was warned that the raider was operating in the southern part of the Indian Ocean. The trip was made without incident.
