

Paraphrase of telegram received from the American
Consul at Gibraltar, dated October 23, 9 a.m.

Stark

I have made the suggestion to the Gibraltar Contra-
band Controll Officer, referring to the warning of Germany
against neutral vessels being convoyed by allied war
vessels, that neither the Exporter of the American Export
Line nor the Oakman of the Lykes Brothers Steamship Company
be subjected to convoy to England to discharge cargo which
may be condemned. The Officer is desirous of disposing
of the cases without that, but in accordance with instruc-
tions from London. There has been no answer from London
authorities as to what shall be done with the cotton, coke,
etc., for Switzerland for more than a week, during which
time the two freighters have been here. The Exporter is
carrying over one hundred bags of U.S. Mail for Mediterranean
ports.
