The collision tore away the ship's forward projecting stem plate from the 14' draft mark to the fore foot, and slightly indented the port bow shell plating. The pier sustained considerable damage. E. I. RUTLAND, Chief Engineer, stated that the accident was due to the by-pass valve on the telemotor in the steering engine jarring. Vibration may have opened this valve.
