THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION HAS BEEN RECEIVED

AMERICAN VESSEL "FREDERICK REMINGTON" - DURBAN 31 May 1943.

The 1st Officer and Chief Steward reported that FRANCISCO PELLOT, dish washer, was a menace on board and that it was desirable to have him removed. When under the influence of liquor he refused duties and threatened to knife the Chief Steward. First Officer had him put in chains for attacking the Chief Steward. The Master reported that PELLOT was all right when sober and he did not think it necessary to change him.
