AULTMAN: Pollution of the navigable waters of San Francisco Bay. At approximately 1600, 25 March, 1946, Lieutenant Shirk, U. S. Navy Bunkering Section, Yerba Buena Island, notified the COTP Oil Pollution Inspector that subject vessel had an oil spill while taking bunker oil aboard at Anchorage 9, Berth 183. Upon investigation by the inspector, it was found that the USS AULTMAN had spilled oil down the port side, aft. The vessel was boarded and A. R. Knauff, First Assistant Engineer was interviewed. He stated that the Army Transport Service had taken the vessel over from the Navy on 22 March, 1946 and that the personnel aboard were not familiar with the valves of the ship. He further stated that, as the vessel was receiving bunker oil on the starboard side, the oil was running out an overflow vent on the port side. He said that the vessel was not topping off at the time and that the tanks were not full.
