SAN FRANCISCO.--MORE THAN 1,000 NAVY VETERANS OF THE PACIFIC WAR WERE SAFELY ASHORE IN SAN FRANCISCO HARBOR RESCUED BY DESTROYERS AND PATROL BOATS AFTER THE LIBERTY SHIP S. S. HENRY BERGH WENT AGROUND OFF THE FOG-SHROUDED FARALLONE ISLANDS, JUST 20 MILES WEST OF THE GOLDEN GATE.

TWELFTH NAVAL DISTRICT HEADQUARTERS ANNOUNCED THAT ALL PERSONNEL ABOARD THE TRANSPORT HAD BEEN REMOVED FROM THE WRECKED VESSEL, THE ROCKY ISLANDS, AND FROM THE FRIGID WATERS IN WHICH SEVERAL HUNDRED FLOATED ON RAFTS AND IN LIFE JACKETS. NO CASUALTIES OR INJURIES WERE REPORTED.
