EXCERPT TO COAST GUARD.

The following information has been received:

"Edward STANLEY, Wiper aboard the SS HUBERT HOWE BANCROFT, was stopped going through the Dock Gate at Liverpool, on the 24 Sept 1943, with a suitcase full of cigarettes. He was prosecuted for smuggling and fined £-40. Since he was unable to pay the fine, he was sentenced to 30 days in prison.

"E. G. Lampert, Wiper, was left in a British hospital. The SS HUBERT HOWE BANCROFT sailed two men short.

"This information is dated 29 September 1943.
