SUBJECT: TRANSMITTING CREW LIST OF S.S. IRISH OAK.

SIR:

I have the honor, in compliance with paragraph (E) of the Department's circular instruction to the American Embassy at London by airgram dated September 8, 1942, 6.45 p.m., to transmit herewith a complete list of the crew, with name and rating of each member, of the Irish steamship IRISH OAK, which sailed from Dublin for an unknown American port on October 25, 1942.

It may be added that this vessel originally desired to proceed first to Boston, and subsequently to load phosphates at Tampa, and possibly to call at Norfolk, but in view of the ruling contained in paragraph (A) of the aforesaid circular instruction, the details of the proposed voyage were left unsettled at the time of sailing.
