MEMORANDUM FOR THE CHAIRMAN OF THE CREW DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE,  
WAR SHIPPING ADMINISTRATION.

The Coast Guard has received information from a reliable source alleging that Baker Edward Killman, Master of the SS ISAAC T. COLES violated a wartime security measure on 13 August, 1943 by permitting a stranger to come aboard and remain aboard for about 10 hours while the SS ISAAC T. COLES was in Palermo, Sicily.

The Coast Guard will instigate whatever disciplinary action is warranted in this case.
