

NOTED - THE TWO HALVES OF THE VESSEL WERE LATER SEEN BY AIRCRAFT WHICH DIRECTED A BRITISH NAVAL VESSEL TO THEIR VICINITY, ON 3/16/43, WAILE THE BRITISH SHIP HAD THE BOWNSECTION IN TOW, IT SUNK ON 3/17/43.

THE BRITISH SHIP HAD THE BOWNSECTION BY GHELLFIRE THE STERN THERE FORE, THE BRITISH SHIP LOCATED AND SUNK BY GHELLFIRE THE STERN SECTION ON 3/18/43.

HOWEVER, HIT AND DEMOLISHED THE MOTOR LIFEBORT, WHICH LIFEBORT HAPPENED TO BE IN WAY OF THE TORPEDO'S COURSE TO
THE SINKING VESSEL. IN THIS INCIDENT ONE MAN WAS LOST.
