Summary of Information:

1. The following from an official report of activities in the Fourth Naval District is forwarded as of interest.

On May 18, 1942 the Coast Guard apprehended one Live STEARMAN (Negro), longshoreman, 1519 Segbert Street, Philadelphia wanted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation for failure to register for Selective Service.

May 20. 1942 the Wildwood Coast Guard Station at 1615 received a message from the Naval Air Station. Cape May, N. J., that the SS JASON had rammed and sunk YP boat 387 in latitude 39-02 North, longitude 74-39 West. Motor Lifeboat 4062 was immediatley dispatched to the scene to search for survivors. The JASON had picked up sixteen survivors, fifteen of which were transferred to the station boat. These were in turn placed on the CGC 477 and taken to the Naval Air Station. One injured survivor remained on the JASON and was landed at Lewes, Del., for further medical treatment.
