MEMORANDUM FOR THE CHAIRMAN OF THE CREW DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE,
WAR SHIPPING ADMINISTRATION.

Included on a list of men being repatriated to the U.S. on the SS JOSEPH NICHOLSON are the following men who are reported to us, through a reliable source, to have committed the following offenses.

George Millious, formerly 2nd Cook on the SS WILLIAM MULHOLLAND, is reported to have been absent without leave at the sailing time of the SS WILLIAM MULHOLLAND. No date is given.

Vladas Adamsvicius, formerly A.B. on the SS CALEB STRONG, is reported to have missed his ship twice in a period of a few weeks. No specific dates are reported, however.

Jack Cameron, formerly Bos'n on the SS W.D. HOWELLS is reported to have been absent without leave at the sailing time of the SS W.D. HOWELLS. No date is given.

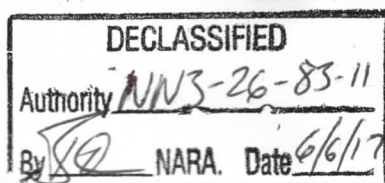
Leonard Smith, formerly 3rd Cook on the SS OLIVER H. PERKY, is reported to have been discharged from that vessel for general inefficiency. No details are presented.

Keene P. Newcomb, (rating not reported) and Maurice A. Sheppard (rating not reported) formerly of the SS LAWTON B. EVANS, were tried for some unnamed offense by a tribunal in Oran. No further details are presented in the report at hand.

Clarence O. Newton, formerly Fireman-Watertender on the SS THOMAS B. ROBERTSON, was tried in Oran for some unstated offense. No further details are reported at the present time.

E. Domschke, formerly Purser on the SS LOUISA M. ALCOTT, was arrested in Oran, tried by a tribunal there and fined for some offense that is not presently reported.

The Coast Guard will instigate whatever disciplinary action is warranted in these cases.
