1. The subject vessel is owned by West India Sales Limited of New York, N.Y. and is registered at Panama City, Panama. This vessel is under charter to the Saguenay Terminals Limited from 23 February 1941 for a period of 6 - 9 months.

2. This vessel entered St. Thomas, Virgin Islands on 10 September 1941 from Georgetown, British Guiana with a cargo of 2434 tons of bauxite to discharge at this port. The Saguenay Terminals Limited being a British Company, the radio of the vessel was sealed on arrival at this port in compliance with orders.
