Anastasios Sarafoglou, formerly Third Officer of the Panamanian tanker "SS LODA" signed on the tanker SS ANTIOPE as a nonworking member of the crew for transportation to the Canal sone, where he is to be turned over to Fernel & Co., agents for further disposition. Sarafoglou has created no end of trouble on the west coast of South America, and it is highly recommended that the Commandant 15th Naval District assist the agents in placing him on a ship that does not touch ports on the west coast of South America, or at least on a ship other than the LODA or ANTIOPE.
Numerous reports have been made relative to the conduct of Anastasios Sarafoglou, Third Officer of the Panamanian tanker SS LOUDA. The most recent report is made by the Naval Observer at Talara, Feru, on 30 June 1943. A copy of the agreement signed at that time is quoted as follows:
"I, JONAS ELIAS HAGGLOF, MASTER OF THE PANAMANIAN TANKER "LOIDA", OF PANAMA, REPUBLIC OF PANAMA, AGREE, IN THE NAME OF THE COMPANY AND THROUGH THEIR AGENTS, TO FURNISH THE THIRD OFFICER, ANASTASIOS SARAFOGLOU, WHOSE CONTRACT EXPIRES ON JULY TENTH, 1943, WITH THE FOLLOWING:
" 1. TRANSPORTATION TO CALLAO BY OMNIBUS AND EXPENSES IN CALLAO OR LIMA AT TEN SOLES A DAY UNTIL SUCH TIME AS HIS PASSPORT SHALL ARRIVE FROM THE GREEK CONSUL IN ANTOFAGASTA, CHILE, AND UNTIL SUCH TIME AS PASSAGE CAN BE SECURED BY AIR TO PANAMA, AND/OR PASSAGE BY SHIP TO PANAMA AND/OR PASSAGE BY SHIP TO A U.S. PORT.
" 2. COST OF PASSAGE BY AIR TO PAHAMA AND/OR CUST OF PASSAGE BY SHIP, AS NON-WORKING CREW LEEDER TO PANAMA AND/OR COST OF PASSAGE BY SHIP AS NONWORKING CREW MEMBER TO UNITED STATES PORT.
" 3. WAGES IN FULL UP TO AND INCLUDING JULY TENTH, 1943.
" 4. IF TRAVEL BY PLANE, SIX DOLLARS (\$6.00) FOR HOTEL EXPENSES IN CALI, COLOMBIA, OR GUAYAQUIL, ECUADOR.
" 5. EXPENSES IN SUM OF FIVE DOLLARS (\$5.00) PER DAY DURING STAY IN REPUBLIC OF PANAMA OR CANAL ZONE.
* 6. A LETTER TO FERNIE AND COMPANY AT BALBOA REQUESTING PASSAGE FOR SUBJECT AS NOWORKING CREW MEMBER WITH ALL EXPENSES PAID TO UNITED STATES PORT ON THE FIRST

"SIGNED JONAS ELIAS HAGGLOF MASTER OF "LOIDA" "I, ANASTASICS SARAFOGLOU, THIRD OFFICER, "LOIDA" ACCEPT THE ABOVE OFFER. "SIGNED "ANASTASIOS SARAFOGLOU "THIRD OFFICER, "LOIDA" Sarafoglou arrived in Lima without his passport and caused some little embarrasment to the International Petroleum Company, who acted as agents for the tanker. The Naval Attache cooperated in securing a Greek passport which the Greek Consul at Antofagasta sent by courier to the Maval Attache in Lina. Upon receipt of this passport on 9 July 1943, it was immediately turned over to the International Petroleum Co. for delivery to Mr. Serafoglou. On that date the International Petroleum Co. advised that they had just been warned by the Captain of the Port of Callao that if Sarafogleu was not gotten out of the country without further delay that a fine of 5,000 soles would be imposed. The Naval Attache discussed the case with the Director of Port Captains and convinced him that the case had many angles to it and that it was not just a case of persecution by the Captain of the ship, as he had believed. The Naval Attache explained that the owner's son was on board and was in full accord with what was taking place. He then agreed not to impose the fine if Jarafoglou was gotten out of Peru within a reasonable length of time. This information was given to the International Petroleum Co. representatives. The Naval Attacke has been advised this date that Sarafoglou was placed on board the tanker ANTIOPE which sailed from Callac for Balboa. They have instructed the ship's agent, Fernei & Co., Balboa, to look out for him on arrival. It is believed that Fernei and Co. anticipates signing him on either the IGOR or the ANGORA. The Commandant 15th Naval District is requested by copy of this report to assist its in any way to settle this case, as Sarafeglou has caused no end of trouble and annoyance to the various routing officers on the west coast of South America. possible CONFIDENTIAL
