CHARGE:

The Master, Tho. J. Vatis, 533 Spoleto Drive, Santa Monica, Cal., charged that this third officer was a professional psychological saboteur who was an agitator spreading discontent among the crew and subtly undermining the morale of the seamen. The Master reported that he had, for several weeks, received letters from members of the Greek crew which were insulting and complaining, especially from the engine crew personnel. They generally threatened not to attend to their duties as they had done before. Sarafoglou also wrote such insulting letters, and it was the Master's general opinion that he was, with the aid of two of lieutenants, spreading disorder and lowering morale in the crew personnel. For this reason, the Master was asking the aid of one Captain J. Hagloff, care International Petroleum Company, at Talara, Peru, in having these three persons discharged.
